Students with disabilities gather to gain leadership skills at 12th Annual Florida Youth Leadership Forum

TALLAHASSEE - High school students from all over the state with wide-ranging disabilities are convening in Tallahassee and the Capitol this week for the 12th Annual Florida Youth Leadership Forum (YLF). Hosted by the Able Trust, students will spend the week learning about career options, workforce skills, and educational opportunities.

A highlight of the week will be the Mentor's Luncheon with guest speaker Richard Salem **on Friday, July 22 at the FSU University Center Club**. Salem, an influential lawyer and disabilities advocate who is also blind, will share his remarkable story to inspire this year's delegates.

YLF is a four-day forum designed to teach students with disabilities about career planning and leadership through workshops, social gatherings and mentoring opportunities. High school students with disabilities from across the state participate in the annual event co-sponsored by The Able Trust and the Florida Developmental Disabilities Council.
