#### Scope of Work/Narrative

This section includes a summary of the research plan and other items specific to achieving the outcomes related to the project.

This project supports Goal 3 of the State Board of Education's K-20 Strategic Plan: Skilled Workforce and Economic Development. The Able Trust has set a goal of closing the labor force participation gap between Florida's general population and that of Floridians with disabilities by ten percentage points in ten years. This translates into bringing an additional 300,000 Floridians into the workforce by 2032. The Able Trust believes that the decision-making and system change required to accomplish this goad must be grounded in data and research. Otherwise, we are operating on assumptions and anecdotal information which can lead to the wrong conclusions and waste valuable resources. An extensive analysis must be conducted of state, regional, and local economic data/research which define the existing conditions of disability workforce inclusion in Florida. At the same time, we intend to engage our partners and stakeholders throughout the state to learn from their experiences, challenges, and success. This holistic approach will allow us to identify the root causes of disability un- and underemployment along with opportunities for greatest positive impact.

The Able Trust, under this project, will:

- Secure research partners including FDOE/VR to lead economic and data analysis.
- Identify credible sources including existing data, new data, and stakeholder input and ensure data integrity.
- Develop reports of data including causes, gaps, and solutions for increasing disability employment in Florida.
- Test, iterate, and validate solutions using a social impact model that is based on the scientific method.

The Able Trust has engaged with three research partners for this initiative, each with distinct roles and responsibilities. Following is a description of each of these relationships and projected outcomes/deliverables.

Lightcast, formerly Emsi/Burning Glass (Total: \$220,000; For this project: \$55,000)
Emsi/Burning Glass will provide data and analyses to help us better understand the population of Floridians with disabilities. The data and analyses will include:

- Economic Data Analysis using existing data as well as publicly available sources of data to report employment statistics, population estimates, industry projections, economic forecasts, and skills supply and demand. This analysis will be completed for the state of Florida, 22 MSAs in Florida, 24 counties not included in a Florida MSA, and seven Vocational Rehabilitation Regions in Florida. Additionally, recommendations will be provided to address rural communities in Florida.
  - Key Deliverables: Data file of research findings and narrative report
- **Literature Review** a collection of research, studies, and strategies from across the United States will be reviewed.

- o Key Deliverables: Data file of research findings and narrative report
- Employer, Community Organizations, and Individual/Family Surveys a series of client-approved surveys will be distributed to relevant stakeholders.
  - o **Key Deliverables**: Data file of research findings and narrative report
- **Stakeholder Listening Sessions** interviews will be conducted to better understand the various challenges and opportunities in serving Floridians with disabilities.
  - Key Deliverables: Data files and narrative report identifying key themes from responses
- **Findings and Recommendations** a fully designed report including all research, findings, literature, outcomes, themes, and recommendations
  - Key Deliverables: Professionally designed and formatted PDF of Final Report, digital file organized to include all research, professionally designed and formatted PDF of an Executive Summary Report, a PowerPoint presentation for stakeholder communication.

#### Dr. Jerry Parrish (\$24,000)

Dr. Parrish will provide data and analyses to help us better understand the population of Floridians with disabilities. The data and analyses will include:

- A current analysis of the American Community Survey data including data on employment, unemployment, and "not in the workforce" data for persons with a disability in Florida at the state and county levels.
- Studies on the transition of individuals with disabilities into post-secondary education and/or employment; prevalence of employment of PWD in growing and in-demand industries by Florida region; the economic impact to the state for closing the laborforce participation gap; and other subject areas deemed appropriate by The Able Trust and FDOE/VR.
- Development and release of economic/data reports
- Presentations to economic development and other business/industry groups, legislators, and conferences.
  - Key Deliverables: A minimum of four economic/data reports and a minimum of four presentations to economic development and business/industry groups, legislators, and FDOE/VR leadership.

#### *Spring Impact (\$83,780)*

As The Able Trust receives the research findings and recommendations, we intend to rapidly iterate on potential solutions for increasing and improving employment opportunities for Floridians with disabilities. To bolster and accelerate our reach, we will use a social impact model to hypothesize, test, and iterate solutions to the challenges and barriers within Florida's vocational rehabilitation and disability employment systems. Spring Impact specializes in a social impact, scientific method, otherwise known as 'Lean Innovation'. Spring Impact will provide training and support in designing and implementing research 'experiments' as well as professional coaching services to support on-going learning and implementation. Objectives of our work with Spring Impact include:

- Training a core group of The Able Trust team members in Lean Innovation, advancing our potential for impact at scale
- Identifying 1-3 solutions to test and iterate as 'experiments'
- Coaching staff on scaling and developing viable solutions to employment barriers experienced by persons with disabilities.
  - Key Deliverables: Work plan and key dates; mural with workshop outputs; documented learnings from experiments; experiment data tracker; Lean Innovation Report (quarterly and final)

## In addition to managing these research consultant relationships and projects, The Able Trust staff will be responsible for (\$87,220):

- Publishing and sharing data/economic reports
- Promoting research findings through reports, The Able Trust website, social media, webinars, presentations, meeting with legislators and FDOE executive staff including the VR Director
- Working with VR leadership to ensure data, reports, and outcomes are supporting the work and goals of the Division.

The Project Recipient's Agency Head is responsible for ensuring that all Funded Providers comply with all fiscal and programmatic requirements of the AWD Program included in this Request for Applications, the Florida Department of Education Green Book, and all other applicable statutes and regulations.
- B. Every Funded Provider receiving funding from the Project Recipient listed on the DOE 101 under a line item entitled Contracted Services, Other Purchased Services, etc., including the amount of AWD funding that the Funded Provider will receive from the Project Recipient.
- C. A Funded Provider shall be a separate organizational entity that is not under the organizational structure of the AWD funded Project Recipient (college or school district). For the purpose of this form, the term "Operational Control" refers to day-to-day control over AWD program operations, locations, teachers, curriculum, management oversight, etc.
- D. The services provided by every Funded Provider are included in the Program Narrative.
- E. The Project Recipient has a written, executed agreement with each funded provider that includes
  - 1. A reference to the Adults with Disabilities Grant.
  - A provision that binds the Funded Provider to the terms of the 2022-2023
     Adults with Disabilities Grant RFA (Request for Application) and to the Project Recipient application.
  - 3. The total amount of 2022-2023 Adults with Disabilities Grant funding being paid to the Funded Provider by the Project Recipient.
  - 4. A requirement hat AWD funds issued to but not expended by the Funded Provider shall be returned to the Project Recipient.

- 5. A stipulation that upon the termination of a Funded Provider, all AWD inventory property shall be returned to the Project Recipient.
- F. The Project Recipient has a budget narrative from the Funded Provider that includes:

- G. The Project Recipient is responsible for having all records available for inspection, including those of all Funded Providers.
